University System of Georgia Helps Secure \$30 Million Investment and up to 110 Jobs in New ThyssenKrupp Operation in Alpharetta

Economic Development is key point of contact for ThyssenKrupp for ongoing collaborations with University System of Georgia (USG)

In 2010, Economic Development staff answered the call from the Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce for "Project Hardware," which held the promise of a new IT Professional Services Headquarters in Georgia. The Economic Development staff met with the prospect several times, providing requested information on several USG degree programs, opportunities for collaboration with faculty, and international education programs, and then waited for the company's decision, along with the rest of the Georgia team. The announcement came on January 6th, 2011; ThyssenKrupp was moving its IT headquarters to Alpharetta.

Now that ThyssenKrupp is ramping up its operations in Alpharetta, Economic Development gives the company a single point of contact to explore collaboration with USG institutions for student internships, students studying abroad, research, recruiting graduates, and executive education. Robert Trotter, president and chief information officer of ThyssenKrupp IT Services North America, met with key University of Georgia (UGA) faculty and staff on campus in March 2011 to begin laying the foundation for future collaborations.
